Welcome to online worship. A few things to help you prepare for worship wherever you are.

If you're following along with others, ask people to take turns reading the prayer or scripture out loud. If you're on your own, try reading out loud even though you're the only one listening. Sometimes reading out loud can help us focus even more.

If you are accessing this on your computer, put your phone on silent and put it away somewhere you can't see it. Make sure your email is closed and you won't get any alerts from anywhere. If you're on your phone, maybe put it on do not disturb so you won't get calls or texts while you're reading, listening and praying.

Now, once you've done that, make sure you're in a comfortable place. Put your feet on the ground. Let your shoulders loosen up. Close your eyes. Take five deep breaths. As you breathe in, breathe in the Holy Spirit, who gives us all life. As you breathe out, breathe out the fear, anxiety, worry, everything that separates us from God.

Let us worship God.

Holy God, why is it that we look but do not see? Bring us again and again into your light Until your ways become visible to us, And bear fruit in us. Touch us so that we are utterly changed, A "before" and "after," A "now" and "then"; That we may also say, "One thing I do know, that though I was blind, now I see." Lord we believe; help our unbelief. In Christ's light we pray. **Amen.**¹
