Halloween and Saint Mark

It is, or soon will be, Halloween. As a Pastor, I suppose it may surprise some that Halloween is my favorite holiday. The attraction is not really the candy (I've gotten too conscious of my health to eat it) or dressing up in a costume (I do that on Sunday mornings as it is). Rather, what attracts me, is the sense of the in-between-ness of the fall equinox, and of course, the sense of darkness which descends as is its task.


Ghost stories originated around the fire, or much better, inside, where there is safety to speak of things that bring fear and doubt. Sitting next to a light, even with its sibling darkness surrounding, gives a sense of a fleeting confidence that perhaps there is a safety given that allows for honest conversation about what makes us most anxious; that which we do not fully know, and cannot fully see. It remains stubbornly hidden.

It is worth stating that Jesus is described as a ghost several times in the New Testament, I suppose he startled people. I'm not sure what glossary you use to speak of Jesus or the invasion of the sacred in life, but "startling" is not one we often use, or even desire. Yet Christ can awaken in a way that troubles, even as one is given the promise of hope. We are living through painful times as we see the failure of humanity on multiple levels if we seek to gaze fully. Yet the light, and one can say, the darkness, which startles, continues to beckon us closer, asking only for full honesty. Change often delays when we are comfortable, it is through uncanny revelation of needed truth from which we begin to awaken to a new perspective, and new action.

On this Halloween, I wish all of you, but especially your children, a safe and wonderful "All Hallows Eve." For those who know their church calendar, All Saints Sunday is just around the corner, seeking to give closure to what has breached open upon the night of the Irish Samhain.



May Christ confound you, but also bless you, May your life and the lives of others be fuller, and able to bless the dark, and give peace.

Saint Mark Presbyterian Church Budget vs. Actuals: 2023 Budget - FY23 P&L January - September, 2023



During Q3 (as of September 30th), the financial picture has improved in that we are on track to have a smaller deficit than the \$137,000 deficit that was originally planned. At the 3/4 point in the year, our deficit stands at about \$76,000. A major contributor to the improvement has been Building Use/Service Income. A total of about \$26,000 in Business Use/Service Income was collected during Q3, as compared to a total of about \$16,000 during the first two quarters of 2023. However, the above excludes major (6-figure) costs that it now appears are likely to be incurred during 2023/24 to address urgent issues with the HVAC system in the Education Building. The Property Team is in the process of soliciting and evaluating bids for this work, before recommending a specific proposal. 

and wanted to see if you would like to help me with a towel donation drive. My Eagle project is supporting Second Chance Wildlife Center in Gaithersburg. Second Chance is a non-profit that gives care to injured and orphaned wildlife with the goal to release them back to their intended roles in nature. Each year they receive 3,000 wild animals to rehabilitate. I am organizing several

different projects to support Second Chance, and one of them is a towel drive.


